A strength of the program is the inclusion of supervised practicums, which allows for opportunities to work with a wide variety of readers.

The Literacy Minor and Endorsement is recognized by the State of Idaho as authorization to teach reading at any grade level, K-12. Completion of the coursework for this minor plus successfully passing the Praxis II exam (#0300-Reading Specialist) will lead to an endorsement that enables graduates to perform the duties of a reading teacher at K-12 levels, and to act as reading resource teachers and consultants on reading improvement in their own buildings.
